



Biography Olga Suvorova

Olga Suvorova was born in Saint Petersburg, Russia in 1966. Olga studied at the famous Repin Academy of Fine Arts in Saint Petersburg, where she studied monumental composition with the celebrated Russian painter Professor A. A. Mylnikov. Her career has been greatly influenced by her parents, both highly praised artists in St. Petersburg. Other sources of influence include Gustav Klimt, Piero Della Francesca, and traditional Russian icons.

As a student her painting "Conversation" was shown in Hamburg 1989 in an exhibition of Leningrad's young artists. She was awarded the gold medal for that year and her talent was rewarded with a unique exhibition at the institute in the spring of 1990. Her paintings of the players in "Comedia del arte" have a haunting quality that sets her apart from the many young talented artists emerging from the Institute. She also was honored with President's Yeltsin's Artist prize from a competition among more than 3.000 artists.

Nowadays Olga is an accomplished artist, a well-recognized master, possessing her own inimitable, easily recognizable style, and a member of the Union of Artists of Russia.

It is for her stirring portraits that Olga first gained her reputation in Russia, and then abroad. These paintings have a startling vitality. Filled with warmth and harmony, the paintings of Olga make the viewer's soul kinder and more compassionate. In her paintings Olga sometimes uses silk fabrics for costume details.

Olga's paintings are in private collections in Italy, Germany, Sweden, Finland, France, Britain, the United States, Switzerland, Holland and China. Her work is highly regarded and acquired by galleries and serious art collectors around the globe.
